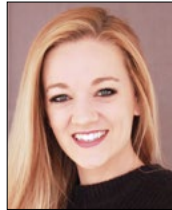

Adopting a Rangerette can be a heart-warming, rewarding experience, and this year the Adopt-a-'Rette program made upgrades to enhance and improve the connections.

Rangerettes learned the identities of their Forevers at the same time, during the workweek of Show-offs. The Rangerette directors and adoption committee approved the matches, and surveys of both potential adopters and Rangerettes helped to make those connections based on shared interests and commonalities. No active Rangerette was assigned more than two official Forevers, in an effort to distribute Forevers more evenly among the current team members.

2024? To adopt a Rangerette, you must: be a lifetime Rangerettes Forever member at the Classic or Platinum level; be at least three years past your time in uniform; commit to texting, writing or calling your adoptee at least once a month; and complete a Google form after Sign Drop that will assist in matching you with your Rangerette and

establishing communication with her. You'll be able to request a specific Rangerette or opt to be matched with one who shares interests or other commonalities.

Adopters are NOT required to live in the immediate radius of Kilgore — or even in Texas. You are not required to attend events (though it's always wonderful when you can). With time and intention, you can create a close-knit relationship with texts, email, phone calls and/or letters. Gifts are NOT mandatory; the only requirement is consistent, positive communication with your Rangerette.

FOREVER REMEMBERS HER MOMENT WITH A ROYAL

Lisa McCutcheon Walker, 45th Line, celebrated the coronation of King Charles III last May in royal fashion — with Richard Hyde, British consul general in Houston.

The consulate invited Walker after seeing her Rangerette photo (in which she is pictured alongside then-Prince Charles) during Hyde’s visit to Kilgore College, part of the “Great British Road Trip 2022.” Walker’s royal encounter took place during Charles’ trip to Texas in the mid-1980s. **Click here** to read The Washington Post’s account of the interaction.

“We were expressly instructed NOT to speak to him,” Walker recalled in a Facebook post about the royal meeting. “But.....he veered off that red carpet to talk to the beautiful girl next to me - Kathy O’Rear Locke and when he asked her about our skirts I jumped in and answered his question.”

thing from so long ago,” Walker said of her coronation invitation. She made plans to attend the event in Houston, purchasing multiple fascinators and planning “a whole day of glamor.”

“I got a spray tan for like the second time ever,” she said. She delegated her hair and makeup. “I felt like a queen. I mean, it was so much fun.”

Then it was off to celebrate the king, along with her plus-one and the rest of the Kilgore College delegation.

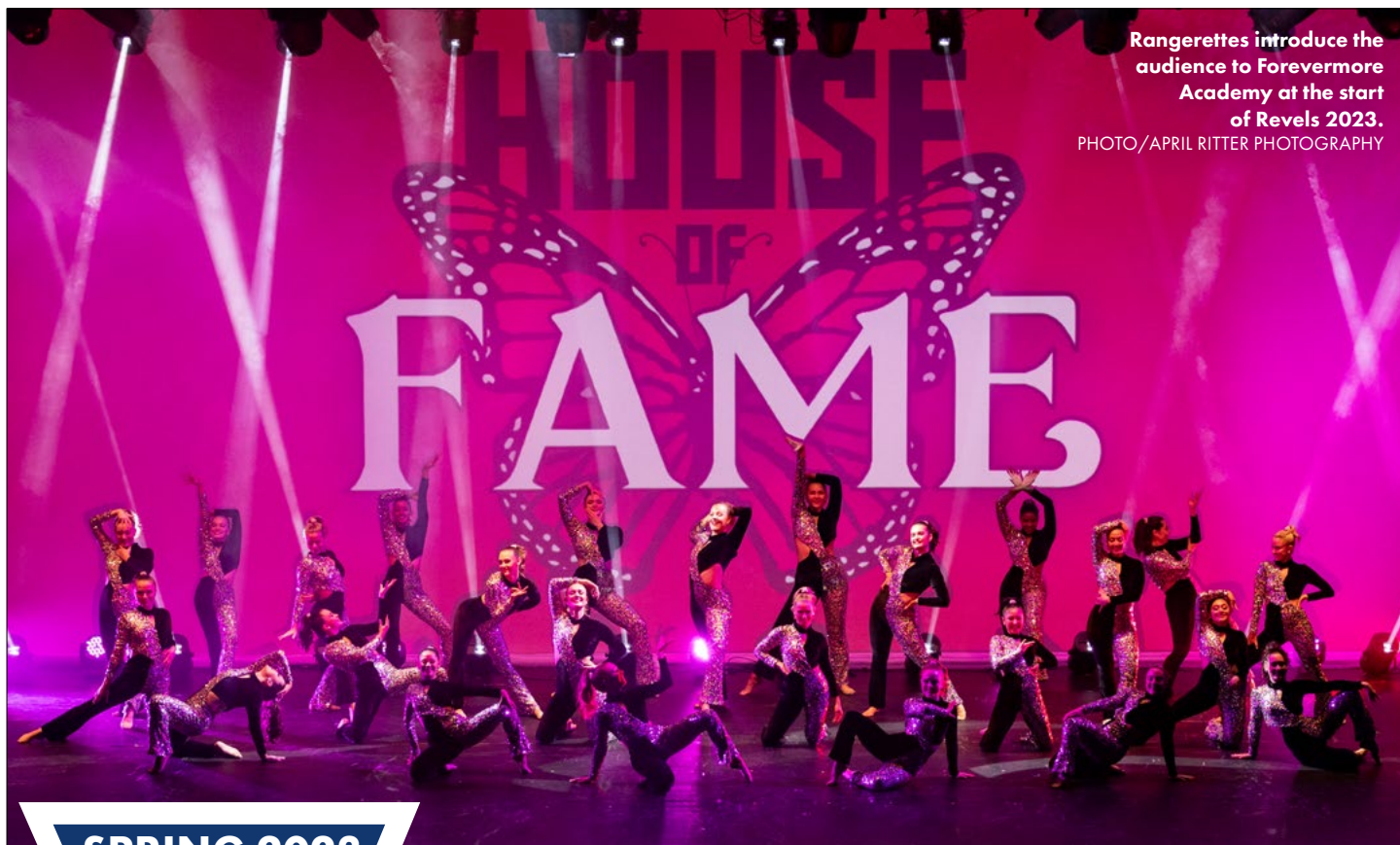

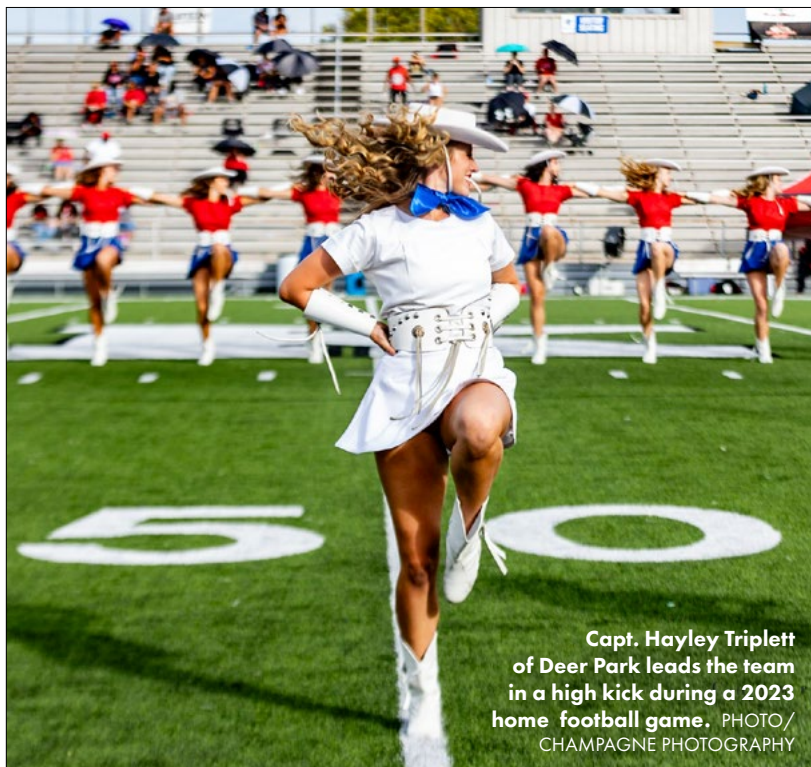
